TALKING WITH OUR CHILDREN

Talk is a foundation for learning, talking helps children develop knowledge and understanding of the world, increase their vocabulary, practice the conventions of conversing, develop social skills and spark their curiosity. Reading with your child, playing games, reflecting on experiences etc can provide a wonderful opportunity for talk where we can support the development of turn taking, listening, problem solving, planning whilst having fun and building language skills. When you share language with your children such as reciting poems and rhymes, sharing nursery rhymes and songs you are supporting them to explore new words and grow their vocabularies. Sometimes talking with our children about school and their learning can be interesting as when you ask what they did at school today, the most common answer is, "nothing". You might find some of these questions and/or prompts helpful to start some conversations:

- What made you smile or laugh today?
- What school value did you show today?
- Tell me how you helped someone
- What is something that challenged you today?
- What is something that made you think today or made you curious?
- Tell me about the book your class are reading John Hattie says if you want your children to be superstar learners then talk to them – language is the most important thing!



Health Snippet

Let's Talk Teeth

Children in New Zealand are entitled to free basic oral health services from 0 to 17 years of age. Don't wait for teeth problems to happen, take your child for regular check-ups. Your dentist will let you know how often you need to take your child. Dental check-ups for young children mean problems are recognised and treated early.

Free standard treatments include:

- Check-ups involving a routine examination, checking teeth for decay and looking at gums and mouth for any problems.
- X-rays are used to find tooth decay and other problems that can't be seen.
- Fluoride treatment helps make the surface of the teeth more resistant to decay.
- Fissure sealants are a thin layer of white filling, painted onto teeth that are at risk of developing tooth decay.
- Cleaning removes plaque, staining and tartar from tooth
- Fillings are used to restore teeth that have been affected by tooth decay
- Extractions to remove teeth that have been affected by tooth decay.
