

Keeping Ourselves Safe

In the last two weeks of this term all classes will be taking part in a Keeping Ourselves Safe programme, run in conjunction with the NZ Police.

The children will learn

- to work out when their safety is at risk
- how to keep safe when they meet and mix with other people
- who and how to ask for help if they, or someone they know, is being abused
- to go on asking for help until someone does something to stop the abuse
- that it is important to make and follow personal, family and school safety rules.

Digital Technology

An ongoing focus in our school is to build teacher and student capability to authentically use and integrate digital tools. We are very fortunate to have Ministry of Education funded professional learning this year with Anthony Breese from Cyclone Computers. For the last three days Anthony has been upskilling our teachers to more meaningfully utilise digital technology as tools to both construct and communicate ideas and knowledge. This learning will enable teachers to seamlessly weave in authentic and meaningful local curriculum opportunities with the best digital tools to connect, inspire and empower students.

Winter is often the time when cold viruses and other illness are common in schools and early childhood centres.

WHEN DO I NEED TO GO TO THE DOCTOR?

See a doctor if your child:

Has been unwell and is not improving

Is more irritable, grizzly or sleepy than usual

Breathing very fast

Refusing food or drinks

Has a fever

Has sore ears

Coughs a lot

Has a sore throat

If you are worried about how sick you or your child are at any time don't hesitate to see a doctor.

If you have other medical problems you should see a doctor earlier.

Contact the doctor immediately if you or your child develops any of the following danger symptoms

- Severe headache or neck pain
- Eyes intolerant to light
- Drowsy, floppy, is less alert or difficult to wake
- Skin rash or spots
- High fever
- Vomiting
- Unusual or high-pitched cry
